Plant a Tree in Palestine

"The West Bank nowadays is a concentration camp. Villages and cities are closed: there is no way to move around. 98 Palestinians were killed in the West Bank since the 7th of October; 600 Palestinians have been forcibly removed from their communities.

Fear is everywhere.

What actually terrifies me more is the absence of values in the western governments regarding Israel... especially in the EU, UK and USA.

I believe strongly that we will heal from this and we will build Gaza again."



Working in solidarity at grassroots level the Plant a Tree in Palestine project identifies areas of need by working closely with Palestinian activists and farmers.

With funds raised this year, Plant a Tree, have been able to buy much needed grape plants just in time for this years growing season. Despite the ongoing genocide in Gaza and the increased voilence by Israeli settlers, farmers in the West Bank are

optimistic they will have enough water and a good winter for the next year.
